

<p><b>The intervention</b></p>	<p><b>Colourful Semantics: A Resource for Developing Children's Spoken and Written Language Skills (NHS Forth Valley).</b></p>

<p><b>What does it target?</b></p>	<p>Developed in conjunction with education staff, this resource draws on the principles of Alison Bryan's original colourful semantics approach to provide professionals with an engaging, dynamic way to support children's language development. By coding sentences using colour, symbols and signs, this visual approach aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Teach understanding of question words.</li> <li>• Develop vocabulary and increase sentence complexity.</li> <li>• Increase range and complexity of verbs (children with delayed or disordered spoken language skills often overuse simple verbs such as do, go or get).</li> <li>• Improve children's written language skills.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Who is it for?</b></p>	<p>For teachers and professionals looking to work on language development with children aged four to eight years but can be adapted for older children.</p>
<p><b>What is it?</b></p>	<p>This resource consists of three parts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A printed book containing ready-made session plan ideas.</li> <li>• Black and white vocabulary cards and worksheets.</li> <li>• An online version.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How does it work?</b></p>	<p>The session plans can be used with individuals, small groups, and whole classes, and can be easily adapted by teachers and other practitioners.</p>
<p><b>Who can deliver it?</b></p>	<p>Teaching assistant or teacher.</p>
<p><b>How long does it take?</b></p>	<p>The session plans are a suggestion only and can be easily differentiated for different ages and abilities.</p>

<b>What resources do I need?</b>	The resource pack provides session plans and all resources required to run the intervention.
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<b>How do I show progress?</b>	Tasks in the BDCFT screening tool can be used to record and compare the child's responses when colourful semantics support is used.
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<b>What next?</b>	<p>Continue to work through the levels, depending on the child's responses.</p> <p><b>Colour Coding Levels</b></p>
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<b>Top tips</b>	<p>This resource provides materials that are fully adaptable for different colour coding systems used alongside the colourful semantics approach.
